# 2. Listening Drill

[Toshiyuki] teamLab started in 2001 as an art collective. I created it as a place for various experts to come together and experiment.

Those experts *range from* international artists and architects to programmers and mathematicians seeking to navigate the convergence of art, science, tech and the natural world.

[Toshiyuki] I launched it while I was in grad school. I studied sciences, specializing in physics and mathematics. Like now, if you capture the world through a lens the screen sets the boundary between your body and the cut out world. The point of view is fixed and what to focus on is already determined.

To explore what it means not to be *constrained*, Toshiyuki opened the world's first digital art museum in Tokyo *aptly called* teamLab Borderless. And he says advancements in technology has been the key to greater freedom of expression.

From experimenting with interactive installations to having visitors step into water, teamLab has **wowed people all over** the world in more than 50 cities.

**[Toshiyuki]** When we hinge our artistic expressions on physical items, it's difficult to show change. I think when we free ourselves from those material items, we can express the act of change and even the flow of time itself.

One of its most tucked away museums can be found in a forest in southern Japan. teamLab's Digitized Nature project explores how digital tech can *turn nature into art* without harming it.

**[Toshiyuki]** This forest has been here for a really long time. The garden was created back in the Edo period. It's a historic place where people have lived from generation to generation and has accumulated much meaning. I want people to come here to feel the long continuity of life through our various artworks.

teamLab has no plans to **slow down**, set to open a new museum in Abu Dhabi focused on the concept of environmental phenomena, **slated to open** in 2024.

Toshiyuki says digital technology has made it possible for artworks to expand physically, which allows for manipulating and using much larger spaces. That way, viewers are able to experience the artwork much more directly. Now and in the future.



### Visitor Numbers To Major Art Museums Collapsed In 2020

New data published by The Art Newspaper shows that the Covid-19 pandemic has proven disastrous for major museums and art galleries. 280 major institutions were closed for a collective 41,000 days in total which saw them miss out on a huge number of visits.

Lockdowns in response to Covid-19 sent visitor numbers tumbling by a staggering 77 percent and a recovery will likely take years. This infographic highlights the decline in visitor numbers to the ten most visited museums and art galleries on the planet.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York was closed for just over 200 days and it experienced an 83 percent contraction in visitor numbers. The Vatican Museums were also shuttered due to the pandemic and their visitor numbers also experienced a decline of more than 80 percent. The Musée du Louvre in Paris was also among the institutions badly impacted and it saw a 72 percent fall in its visitor numbes between 2019 and 2020.
